Nurse Informaticists and Mentors Linked through Leadership Development Program

[CHICAGO, III. – March 7, 2024] Three nursing informatics professionals have been selected by the Alliance for Nursing Informatics (ANI) to participate in the ANI Emerging Leaders Program. Based on competitive criteria, Elizabeth A. Sloss, PhD, MBA, RN, CNL; Ann M. Wieben, PhD, RN, NI-BC; and Jennifer Withall, PhD, RN, ACNS, ONC, were selected for this exclusive two-year program designed to develop nurse informaticists capable of assuming national leadership positions in informatics-related organizations. ANI represents nursing informatics professionals in more than 25 nursing organizations and engages in significant public and health policy work to advance innovation in patient care, workforce development and education.

ANI and the Emerging Leaders Program are jointly sponsored by the American Medical Informatics Association (AMIA) and the Healthcare Information Management Systems Society (HIMSS). Launched in 2010, the Emerging Leaders Program alumni hold influential positions in academia, university medical centers, federal government, health systems and hospitals, non-profit organizations and industry. Each leader is partnered with two accomplished nursing informatics leaders to provide monthly mentoring and coaching. The program offers emerging leaders an invaluable opportunity to advance their scholarly work as well as network and participate in educational industry meetings and events. The leadership development experience culminates in the completion of a nursing informatics leadership project, presentations, and published works about the project and the Emerging Leaders Program experience.
