



December 7, 2007 The Alliance for Nursing Informatics (ANI) and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) approved the appointment of Kathryn Hoyman, PhD, RN, BC to serve as the ANI representative to the ANCC Context Expert Panel for Nursing Informatics. Volunteers sitting on a content expert panel play a key role in the development of the profession by identifying the knowledge, skills and abilities of informatics nurses through a logical job analysis, a process that ultimately affects all nurses that practice in a particular specialty area. This appointment is the final step in the establishment of a collaborative relationship with ANI and ANCC. The purpose of the partnership between the organizations is to jointly promote the development of informatics nursing through provision of national certification opportunities for nurses in the field of informatics.
